CAMERON PEAK FIRE

In 2020, Colorado was impacted by its largest fire season in state history. Synergy Disaster Recovery was activated by Larimer County, CO respond to the Cameron Peak Fire – the largest fire in Colorado's history. The Synergy Team worked with the Collaborative Assessment & Recovery Team (CART) to assess and identify potential post-fire risks and their associated magnitude so that the County and its stakeholders can identify and prioritize appropriate mitigation activities for future grant funding.

Analyzing burn severity, soil erosion, debris flow modeling and other data, the Synergy Team will construct a GIS story board map that will assist stakeholder collaboration and coordination in protecting private and public property while improving and maintaining the ecological health of its watersheds.

COVID-19 RESPONSE & RECOVERY

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, Synergy staff responded to Kentucky's State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) activation. Within days of receiving the phone call from Kentucky Emergency Management, both Tracy Doyle and Melinda Hutcherson were on the ground assisting as subconsultants to CDR Maguire Inc. Initially the Synergy team assisted the Planning Section in the EOC with creating strategic pandemic response plans in coordination with Kentucky Public Health, KYEM, the National Guard, and other valuable stakeholders. Eventually the Synergy team was shifted to the Recovery division to work on developing a strategy for FEMA reimbursement, supporting 835 applicants with their COVID-19 streamline project applications.

COVID-19 Long Term Recovery & Implementation

Beginning early in the COVID-19 pandemic, the Synergy Team provided long-term recovery planning support to Larimer County, Colorado. This whole-community planning process involved robust community engagement through the Larimer Recovery Collaborative. Cross-sector collaboration was vital to the informed development of long and near-term actions necessary to address the community's unmet needs, which were exacerbated by the pandemic. Despite planning efforts taking place virtually, the planning process succeeded in engaging a broad cross section of the community and led to development of meaningful implementation actions. The timing of this plan proved especially important, as multiple COVID-19 recovery funding opportunities became available following plan publication. By having these recovery and implementation plans developed, Larimer County was better prepared to best utilize those grant monies for community recovery. This project was unique to Synergy, as it was the first time our team guided long-term recovery planning efforts during an active disaster response.

COVID-19 RESPONSE AND RECOVERY SERVICES

In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, Synergy personnel were activated in Larimer County's Emergency Operations Center (EOC). Within hours of notice, Synergy was on the ground assisting the Finance Section implement its Emergency Response Plan, and assisting in the collection, preparation, and dissemination of COVID-19 relevant data to the county's response teams.

As part of the County's overall response plan, members of the Synergy Team were also tasked to provide epidemiological data analysis, case cluster analysis and liaising with hospitals on data sharing, testing, research and modeling to inform the County's health response plan. The Synergy team was engaged with Larimer County under their previous employer CDR Maguire.

Synergy was also brought in to consult with the Larimer County Collaborative to capture lessons learned, document unmet and immediate needs, and develop an overall recovery plan, which included the administration of over \$15M in Coronavirus Relief Funds.



HURRICANE IRMA DISASTER RECOVERY SERVICES

Collier County was one of the most severely impacted counties from Hurricane Irma. The county sustained extensive damage resulting in an estimated \$200 Million of disaster related expenses

The Synergy team was "boots on the ground" providing EOC support immediately after landfall. HURRICANE IRMA DEBRIS MONITORING

Synergy personnel were activated by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) in response to Hurricane Irma. This activation required monitoring debris removal and overseeing hauling operations in waterways throughout four Florida counties that were impacted by Hurricane Irma. Synergy personnel successfully coordinated resources and navigated the environmental challenges of waterway debris removal throughout 3 separate FDEP debris missions.




HAZARD MITIGATION PLANS

SEVERE STORM & FLOOD RECOVERY SERVICES

Synergy Disaster Recovery along Davis Disaster Consulting personnel were retained by the St. Louis Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) under their former employer, CDR Maguire, to assist in their recovery from severe storms and flooding for two major declarations in 2015 (DR-4250) and 2017 (DR-4317).

2015 TORNADO DISASTER RECOVERY SERVICES

The City of Rowlett, Texas was devested by an EF-4 Tornado on December 26, 2015. Synergy personnel, under former employer, CDR Maguire, provided City personnel with the tools they needed to effectively navigate through several disaster recovery programs administered by state and federal agencies for this disaster.
